Call to Order:

A meeting of the Aloma Elementary School Advisory Council was held in the school's Media Center on February 3. Shawnna Green called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone.

Approval of Previous Minutes:

The January 13, 2020 SAC minutes were viewed. A motion was made by Jeremiah Blanchard to approve the minutes, with Donald Vega seconding the motion. The minutes were approved as written.

Principal's Report/School Budget/School Climate Survey:

- There is a new site-based model that Mr. Vega will receive training in the near future.
- Administration will be sending Intent to Return forms to Aloma employees for the 2020-2021 school year.
 - 1. Known personnel changes:
 - a. There is a classified employee who is finishing her 4-year degree who may seek an instructional position.
 - b. One of our teachers is looking to teach at a middle school.
 - c. One teacher is leaving education—retiring. Diane Gallagher will be ending her career at Aloma.
 - 2. This Friday will have a clear picture of the teachers' desires.
- 2020-2021 projection mobility
 - 1. Kindergarten is always low prior to the start of school. They will show up.
 - 2. At the beginning of this year, we were projected to have 495 students; we now have 535 students at Aloma.
 - 3. Our 2020-2021 projected number is 544. With this number we are scheduled to have another teacher added to the faculty.
 - 4. The 2020-2021 budget will be based on 544 students.
