Response: The Parent Involvement Council represents the Title I Schools for the purpose of providing direction, support, and development of the district Title I Parent Involvement Plan. The Council is comprised of two parent members from each Title I School Advisory Council (SAC). The members of the Parent Involvement Council provide input into the development, implementation and evaluation of all school related plans, including but not limited to the Parental Involvement Policy, LEA Plan, Title I, Part A application, School Improvement Plan and District Improvement and Assistance Plan. The School Advisory Council at each school participates in the development of the Title I budget and percent of allocation to individual schools including the one percent parent involvement set-aside.

The Parent Involvement Council meets at least annually in May. This meeting is used to discuss, write, and update the Parent Involvement Policy for the upcoming year. The Parent Involvement Council meetings will be documented including a combination of sign-in sheets, agendas, handouts, presentation materials, and minutes.

Parents are invited and encouraged to become active members of the SAC and provide input in the development of all plans related to school improvement. Parent, staff, and student surveys will be distributed each year and the results analyzed to evaluate school needs. Data collected throughout the year will be shared with each SAC.

Decisions involving the use of the one percent Title I funds reserved for parental involvement at the school level are made during the development of the School Improvement Plan by the School Advisory Council. Of the one percent, not less than 95% must be allocated to the Title I Schools. The LEA will monitor this process to ensure parents are involved.

**Response:** The LEA will provide necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.

The District Leadership Team consisting of the Assistant Superintendent, Director of Curriculum and Instruction and Director of Exceptional Student Education will meet with the School Leadership of each Title I school each June to review student achievement data and assist in the development and review of all required plans. Required plans are monitored by the school administration and District Leadership Team at monthly staff meeting during the 2014-2015 school year.

The Assistant Superintendent, who is in charge of all Federal Programs, will review each school-level PIP to ensure compliance with all requirements of Section 1118. Plans are due by June 1 of each year. The activities included in each plan will also be reviewed to ensure they will provide meaningful opportunities for parents to become more involved in their child's education.

The Assistant Superintendent meets with the person at each school in charge of implementing their PIP once each semester. At these meetings the implementation of the plan is discussed as well as problems and barriers associated with specific activities. Assistance is provided as needed to ensure the successful implementation of each plan.
