

Teacher's maintain a sign-in sheet and provide a copy to the Assistant Principal who maintains the documentation on the dissemination of information, distribution methods, and timelines. Parents that are unable to attend the Annual Meeting are given a missed meeting sheet to share the important information with them.

Other events are held throughout the year to provide opportunities for parents to understand the state assessments and ways to increase student achievement. We offer evening parent/teacher conferences that discuss expectations for each grade level.
