Response: Umatilla Elementary School believes in involving parents in our Title I programs. The SAC has the responsibility of developing, implementing, and evaluating school level plans, including the SIP and PIP, Title I Plan/Budget, Parental Involvement Plan/Budget, and the School Compact. Parents represent at least 50% of SAC membership. The members of SAC are elected upon by peers (faculty, staff, and parents). Parents are given the opportunity to review the plan and offer their input prior to approval. For the PIP, all parents are given the opportunity to complete surveys at the end of the school year that will give their input in activities, trainings, and materials that are needed to help children. Minutes, agendas, sign in sheets, advertisements are used as documentation of parent input. Parents will be notified of SAC meetings through the school newsletter, website, and marquee.

Response: The family school liaison will be available in our parent resource center to help parents check out materials to help their child at home. Through the use of the "teacher prescription pad", the FSL will be able to better serve the parent/student in materials suitable for the struggling areas. The parent resource center will be available during the school day and during evening meetings such as with SAC and APT meetings.

Response: Umatilla Elementary School will hold two Annual Title I meetings at the beginning of the school year. At these meetings, we will explain to parents what Title I is,

how it works, and the services/resources available through Title I (for students and parents). These meetings are advertised in the school newsletter, school marquee, and on the school website. Sign-in sheets, copies of handouts, and meeting minutes will be kept in the FSL or CRT's office.

During "Meet the teacher / Curriculum Night", parents will be given information regarding school policies, procedures, curriculum, assessments, and expectations. Data collected through STAR, iStation, iReady, and weekly content area tests will determine classroom instruction. Parents are provided grades through Skyward. Parents of students who are in RtI are invited to attend meetings, an invitation is sent home with the student.

Each grade level will offer two report card nights per a school year. Teachers and administrators are available to meet with parents at these meetings as well, or in addition to these meetings. If parents are unable to attend an in person meeting, a telephone conference is scheduled. Sign-in sheets and parent conference forms will be kept.

Response: Parents are provided with opportunities to be involved in their child's education throughout the school year. Opportunities include involvement and participation in our STEM nights, math night, SAC and APT meetings and parent/teacher conferences. Translators for Spanish speaking parents are available at these times. We will also offer a training on our new phonics program to parents so that they can better help their child at home.

Through our Parent Resource Center, computers/ipads will be available for parents to check out so that students and families will have access to Rosetta Stone at home.

For parents of students with special needs/disabilities will be notified in writing of meetings for their child.

In general, parent notifications are provided via school newsletter, school website, school marquee, and letters/forms sent home with students. These notifications are available in English and Spanish.

If parents are unable to attend any meeting about parent involvement, copies of the handouts are available at the school.
