



SAC Team Meeting Minutes February 22, 2017

Opening: The regular meeting of the SAC Committee at Polk Avenue was called to order at 12:00 pm on 02/22/17 by Mrs. Gail Quam.

Approval of Minutes: The motion to approve our meeting minutes was made by Mr. McCance. All in attendance agreed.

Guest Speaker: Mr. Harrington

- Mr. Harrington discussed his recent visit to to FETC (Future of Educational Technology Conference):
 - He attended this event, along with other teachers, to learn what is changing in the field of educational technology. Some highlights included the discussion of virtual reality, 3D printing, coding as literacy, students as makers, robots, and more robots.
 - OMr. Harrington discussed the current technology at Polk Avenue Elementary and our plan to stay current with the trends in technology. One example was the 3D printer and coding class during weekly academies. Mr. Harrington brought models for the committee to see that was created with our own 3D printer. It was also discussed how some of the models were created by students using a design program and some models are pre-designed for students and teachers to use.
 - On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades we already have a one to one ratio of computers to students. Next year 2nd grade will be given the current chromebooks that the 5th graders are currently using, giving 2nd grade a one to one ratio and K-1 will have 10 chromebooks per class. The 5th graders will receive new chromebooks that convert to a tablet. At the beginning of next school year, we will have approximately 450 devices for approximately 500 students.
 - Some of the programs used with the chromebooks are Istation, Measure Up Live, and Prodigy. We also have a Firewall and GoGuardian is used to monitor student activity on all computers at school.

Parent Involvement Plan & Compact: Mrs. Saran.

- Mrs. Saran discussed the Parent Involvement Plan and Compact. All SAC members received a copy of the current Plan and Compact to review.
 - This is a Title 1 requirement.
 - The plan is developed through communication between the school, LEA, and community.
 - The staff create the plan and compact, and the SAC committee approves the new plan and compact at the beginning of each school year.
 - There is a requirement for one annual meeting and there is an allocated budget of 1% for parent involvement. We have meetings two to three times per year during ELA, Math, and Science Family Nights.
 - The school involves parents through mentor and volunteer programs, building capacity activities, and the School Advisory Council.
 - The School-Parent Compact is an agreement between the school and parents about what both the schools and the parents will do to ensure that each child is successful at both school and home.
 - The SAC team needs to read and review the Parent Involvement Plan and Compact. We will discuss improvements at the next meeting.
- Mrs. Batson, the Reading Resource teacher, discussed how our school is using a new reading platform, Measure Up Live (MUL), to address our student's need for depth of knowledge and rigor.
 - For Reading tutoring, current and previous data was used to identify students who need a little more instruction. Groups were designed so that there are no more than 8 students in a group and the instruction is targeted. Teachers use skill specific MUL lessons and students are assigned assessments after instruction in the MUL program to check for mastery.

SAC Team Meeting Minutes March 29, 2017

Opening: The regular meeting of the SAC Committee at Polk Avenue was called to order at 12:08 pm on 03/29/17 by Mrs. Gail Quam.

Approval of Minutes: Mrs. Quam requested to have the statement in the minutes reworded under the Leader In Me Coaching Day. The motion to approve our meeting minutes with the change mentioned prior was made by Mr. Acevedo and second by Jessica Perez. All in attendance agreed.

Guest Speaker: Mrs. Sheppard - National Elementary Honor Society (NEHS)

- The NEHS began at Polk Avenue in 2012 and this is Mrs. Sheppard's 3rd year as the person leading Polk Avenue's NEHS.
- The NEHS is part of a national organization.
- We had 29 new mementers this year, for a total of 41 students in 4th and 5th grades.
- In order to be invited to join NEHS, students must have a GPA of 3.2 or higher. This is a change from last year where students only needed a GPA of 3.0.
- The focus is on 4 ideals of: Leadership, Service, Scholarship, and Responsibility.
- The students meet monthly the discuss how to implement the ideals.
- The NEHS participates in services projects and they work with other NEHS members in the Lake Wales Charter School System. Examples of some projects are:
- TOMs Day Students walk from the lake to school without shoes. This experiences provides students with an opportunity to experience what other children around the world experience.
- Wax museum on Leadership Day
- Coin collection for the Children's Home.
- Pill Bottle collection to donate to other countries.
- Not all elementary schools in Lake Wales has a NEHS group.
- Middle school is the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) and starts in 7th grade. The high school is the National Honor Society (NHS) and starts in 10th grade. Students need to qualify for each level regardless of their previous status.
- The students present at the meeting commented that students want to join the NEHS at the school because they perceive the projects and meetings as fun.

Parent Involvement Plan & Compact: Mrs. Saran.

- Mrs. Saran discussed the Parent Involvement Plan and Compact. All SAC members received a copy of the current Plan and Compact to review at the previous meeting.
 - o Mrs. Saran We meet twice to review the compact and Parent Involvement Plan & Compact.
 - o Questions/Comments about the Parent Involvement Plan & Compact from the committee:
 - Will tutoring be added to this plan or compact? Tutoring is part of Title 1 and the school improvement plan.
 - Will the school continue to use student agendas? Yes.
 - Will parents be trained in Leader In Me? Our school is in the process of training 4 staff members to assist with developing a plan for parent training in Leader In Me.
 - Several grammatical changes were recommended.
 - In the Compact under "Frequent Reports on YOUR CHILD's progress" add Bi-Weekly Reports and Student Led Conferences.
 - In the Compact under "We are depending on YOU (Parent) to…." change Attend/Request parent conferences at least once per year to twice per year.
 - No changes were needed in the Parent Involvement Plan Summary
 - The motion to approve the Parent Involvement Plan and Compact, with the change mentioned, was made by Mrs. Coffee and second by Mr. Acevedo. All in attendance agreed.


Happenings at Polk Avenue

- Events:
 - o FSA ELA (3rd) April 4th and 5th
 - In the past, students who did not "pass" the ELA portion of the grade 3 FSA test were not allowed to move to the next grade level. Students now have multiple opportunities to demonstrate mastery of their 3rd grade ELA by scoring in the 50th percentile or high on the STAR, MAPs, or SAT-10 assessments after they complete their FSA ELA assessment.
 - For students who do not pass based on the above criteria, they can possibly attend summer school which is held at Polk Avenue for our own students.
 - Jessica Perez added that teachers encourage them to do well on all assessments, especially Istation.
 - o FSA CBT ELA (4th & 5th) & Math (3rd, 4th, & 5th) April 10th to 20th
 - Polk Avenue is considered a collaboration school, which is why the 4th grade is testing earlier this year.
 - o FCAT Science (5th) May 2nd & 3rd
 - o Progress Monitoring Window April 24th to May 9th
 - MAPs Assessments three times per year. Students set goals and the school evaluated their learning gains. Our focus is a growth mindset.
- Professional Development for Staff:
 - o FSA Test Administrator Training for 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade teachers
 - Mrs. Hixenbaugh provides this training to all teachers, regardless of teaching or testing experience. If the procedures outlined by the state department are not followed correctly, teachers could lose their teaching certificate.




