We host our Annual Title I Parent Meeting at the beginning of each school year. We plan, review, and improve our Title I programs by working with parents and community stakeholders through School Advisory Council (SAC). We keep parents informed in three languages by sending home flyers, providing the phone dialer, and also through the use of our social media accounts including Twitter and Facebook.

We coordinate with the school district to provide our families with Parent Institutes which include training in core subject areas such as reading, math, and science. We also provide additional institute training for parents in other areas of interest like attendance and discipline, writing, and more. Previously we varied the time of these events and will continue to do so to reach as many families as possible.

We will host additional activities including two student led conferences, STEAM night hosted during Family Literacy Week, Family Movie Night, school-wide walk-a-thon, and parents can schedule conferences at any time during the school year.

We provide translation in Spanish and Creole for each of these meetings/trainings.

Our school will continue to schedule as many parent institutes as is permitted by the district. In addition to these, the events listed in the question above are available for parents to attend as desired. Translation is provided for all trainings/meetings.

Our school hosted its Annual Title I Parent Meeting during our Meet the Teacher event. We notified parents by preparing a flyer in three languages and posting it on school campus. We also listed it on our school marquee, provided the auto dialer, and posted it on social media.

The information was presented to parents in our cafeteria through a powerpoint presentation. There were translators available as needed.

Our presentation included a complete breakdown of our Title I budget including salaries, supplies, parental involvement, etc. This presentation also explained Title I funding and who it supports and how we hope this will have a positive impact on our students/families.

Provide a description of how the meeting will cover the rights of parents at the annual meeting? Throughout the presentation, we remind parents that their input is valued. We remind them that they are permitted to have input into the operation of the school and that usually occurs through our SAC.

All events are scheduled at a variety of different times to ensure parents are given the opportunity to attend. We polled parents about our SAC meeting times last year and the majority (all but 1) wanted to meet in the mornings and schedules were adjusted to accommodate that request. Other events have been scheduled in the mornings and/or evening to make our school a welcoming place for parents. We encourage parents who are unable to attend, to reach out and schedule a time to meet or be involved.

Child care will be provided for specific events such as Parent Institutes. Transportation was also made available to families. Our Parent Involvement Assistant continuously communicates with families to identify and address needs. Our home liaisons reach out to parents to address any critical need areas.

The parent resource room and PK room provides space, computers, and materials for parent use to support the education of their child. We will also be hosting additional support for parents such as our COVE Spanish Meeting, Laptop Parent Training/Meeting, etc.

All parent communication is provided in three languages and is typically sent home via flyer, phone dialer, social media in three languages, and posted on our school marquee.

The newly created Family Organization Station is available to all families. We will reference it throughout the year as a tool to help us communicate better.

We will host a Curriculum Morning in September to allow families time to interact with the teacher and their student in the classroom. They will receive information on the grade level expectations. Parents also receive standards-based progress reports in their home language relative to their child's progress. We also will be sending home our district provided academic newsletters to help increase the home/school connection.

How, if requested by parents, will your school provide opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child(ren)?

Teachers are always available to meet with parents regarding their child's progress and the educational decisions they make for the benefit of the students. Teachers are flexible on the timing of the meetings as long as it does negatively impact instruction for other students. Parents also meet with teams of staff to work through IEPs, behavior plans, 504s, SSPs, etc. All meetings are flexible in timing to best meet the student's needs.

Parents complete surveys including Title I and 5 Essentials. Input from these surveys is used to make adjustments as needed. Parents are also permitted to make comments to front office staff and leadership team members including administrators for consideration. SAC is another portal for parents to communicate with school personnel regarding any concerns.
