The district Title I office monitors and keeps documentation of this on file.

We have a large group of parents who work late; therefore, we will provide flexible scheduling and will offer virtual attendance via facebook live. Information is provided through multiple forms (marquee, flyer, website, stickers in agenda prior to the day of activities). Translation of materials given out will be translated in Spanish as well as we will provide a translator at the meeting. Parents are welcome to bring their child (ren) to the meeting so childcare is not needed.
