Lockhart Elementary takes pride in building the capacity of all stakeholders who play a vital role in the academic success of our students. We provide both staff workshops and parent workshops that strengthen these relationships throughout the school year. Our PEL presents parent engagement modules to all staff in order to heighten their awareness and increase their skill set concerning best practices for interacting with parents.

We recruit community members and organizations to volunteer and support our school. Volunteers register through our Partners In Education (PIE) coordinators as well as our ADDitions coordinators. We partnered with UCF to provide college student volunteers to work one on one with our ELL learners. We partnered with the First Lockhart Baptist Church to provide an after school character development club for students. The church also conducts a food drive and school supply drive throughout the year for students and families.
