- Roadrunner ELA Family Night: As a result of this training, parents will be able to support their children's learning of ELA/Reading
 skill and strategies by knowing the specific codes teachers use to help students interact with text. Doing so will raise achievement.

Coordination and Integration

- Teen Outreach Program: Facilitators from the Teen Outreach Program will attend family engagement activities to provide information
 regarding how their program works with our students/school and how they will support the parents with the academic and social growth
 of our students.
- Multicultural Education: The ELL Coordinator and case manager collaborate with personnel from the Multicultural Education
 Department to involve migrant parents and parents who speak Spanish and Creole with strategies that will help their children to succeed.
- Belle Glade Public Library: Staff members from the Belle Glade Library will attend family engagement activities to provide literature and ideas regarding how their program works with our students and school and how they will support the parents with fostering the academic growth of their children.

Shared Decision-Making

Families will be invited to many meetings throughout the year to receive academic information, reports, and provide input on ways the school, families and students can share responsibility for student success. We hope you will join us for SAC meetings, parent conferences, Title I meetings, and parent trainings.
