How are parents informed of their rights?	Polk County Public Schools Title I program provides all Title I schools with a letter informing parents of their rights. The district Title I office monitors and keeps documentation of this on file.

Materials given out will be translated in English Spanish and Haitian Creole translator will be provided at all meetings. Parents are welcome to bring all of their children with them to any workshop offered throughout the school year. Light refreshments will be provided for all parents who attend. Parent resources and support are made readily available to all parents and families via the Parent & Family Engagement Paraprofessional every school day from 7:00-3:00. On an individual basis, teachers may make home visits to conference with parents who cannot attend a school conference. Our parents will be surveyed at the beginning of the school year and/or at admission during the school year for requested accommodations, such as preferred language of materials sent home (English, Spanish, Haitian-Creole) and/or translation equipment/personal translator needed at meetings and conferences. Our Parent Involvement Paraprofessional will ensure that those accommodations are met. Most communication sent home is translated in Spanish and Haitian Creole. We provide a Spanish and Haitian Creole translator during school hours and at all after school workshops/events.
