Flexible Parent Meetings

<u>Discovery Elementary School</u> will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

Meetings will be held at various times during the day or evening to better accommodate parents.
