Mission Statement

Seminole Middle School strives to empower all students to achieve to their highest potential and become productive members in their community.

Engagement of Parents and Families

Flexible Parent Meetings

The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of statewide assessment systems, standards, and other accountability measures.
