Better accommodate parents. Our school will hold an orientation for parents at each grade level to inform them about the school's participation in the Title I program and to Encourage parents to be involved with reviewing and revising of the School's Title I Plan. Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in the location designated by guidance. Parents will be given a summary of the students' assessment scores and an explanation of the interventions that teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts. Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures. The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of statewide assessment systems, standards, and other accountability measures. Also, the school will host several academic literacy trainings where childcare will be provided.
