Eligibility

In addition, school-level plans are also required. The district and school level plans must be submitted to your school board for approval by August 1. The school board approved plan is due to the Bureau of School Improvement no later than September 1.

Oak Ridge Elementary School will continue to establish a school culture focused on achievement and engage families as partners in their children's learning. School leaders and teachers will be responsible for promoting a school culture that focuses on learning, and for engaging families in the school's efforts to improve student performance through: Developing a coherent strategy for teacher and family communication.

Clarify and monitor expectations for teachers' communication with families.

- Host parent nights to discuss student performance and attendance.
- Core teachers reach out to the families of all their students at least once a month during the school year to discuss students' academic progress.
- Core teachers hold at least one parent-teacher conference with all their students' families during each semester.
- Supported by Family Engagement Center Coordinator, encourage teachers to conduct visits with families who are receptive to engaging with teachers outside the school setting.
- All educators record written and oral communication with families in a log.
- Building families' capacity to support students' academic progress using parent-centered programs such as Parent Resource Center, workshops, and events.
- O Communicate key priorities in the turnaround plan and school-wide focus areas to families in a clear, family-friendly way.
- Educate families on grade-level expectations for rigor for their Family Resource Center manager students in reading and math, and what they can do at home to support those goals.
- Educate families on school behavioral expectations and PBIS protocols and what they can do at home to support those expectations.
- Provide translation into all languages spoken at home in all family communications. Hire a Health Community Specialist for the Resource Center to help families access resources through community agencies to provide extensive services and supports, including supports needed for concerns related to Covid-19 and return to school.
- Investigate successful Parent Academy models to offer parent support and programming. ○ Through the Family Resource Center:
- Analyze school-level data from past events to identify successful strategies for engaging families.

- Offer schoolwide evening events that combine literacy and math development with engaging activities for children and families to learn together.
- Hold schoolwide evening events and workshops to help all families, with a focus on nonnative English speakers, navigate the school system, understand how to interpret grades, FSA results and other data shared with students, and make the link between their child's elementary school experience and their goal to be prepared for college and careers.
- Partner with local agencies to provide parenting workshops on such topics as discipline, nutrition, family recreation or communication.
- Hosting a Parent Academy: Promote the school lunch program and help families understand the benefits of proper nutrition and physical activity.

Academic and Character Standards

2) In order to, establish clearly defined and measurable academic and character standards, Oak Ridge Elementary, will implement the following strategies along with content and subject area related professional development for teachers and administrators: The 5 components below are already in place. Supplemental needs funded with TSSSA funds are addressed subsequently. ELA: Oak Ridge has 120 minutes of English Language Arts Instruction daily. This time block is broken up into two main segments: Reading Instruction (also known as the 90 minute reading block) and Literacy Instruction (writing 30 minutes). During the reading block, teachers are instructing students to use writing as a tool to analyze text, respond to text, conduct research, and make text-based connections that are supported by citing textual evidence. Direct instruction for the writing process and conventions of standard English take place during literacy Instruction. Through the guidance of district literacy trainers and schoolbased literacy coaches, teachers have worked to place many valuable strategies into English Language Arts instruction. Teachers have worked with district staff to integrate the shifts associated with the standards. Professional development has focused on increasing student exposure to non-fiction text, connecting reading and writing, increasing text complexity, and responding to a variety of text through writing. These shifts have been evident in classroom instruction and assessment. Teachers discuss best practices during their collaborative team meetings. Intervention - 30 minutes or more of intervention time is provided for all students five times per week. iReady Instruction & Progress Monitoring - These resources are some of our districts required assessments to progress monitor standards mastery. In addition, the instructional program assists in meeting the diverse needs of students through individualized instructional pathways. Go Math - Oak Ridge Elementary will receive district support to continuously coach teachers. Daily schedules for teachers have been reviewed and a math block has been established to increase time for instruction utilizing standards-aligned curriculum. By setting aside additional time for math, the opportunity for students to attend to the eight shifts of mathematical practices, which encourages inquiry-based problem solving is increasing. District math resource teachers collaborate with instructional staff to gather instructional data to make improvements to Tier I math instruction. Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS) - Oak Ridge Elementary School Improvement Plans focus on strategies for improving systemic implementation structures of the multitiered system of supports (MTSS). In the 19-20 school year an increased focus on determining the impact of Tier 1 instruction in ELA and Math will occur. Leadership will monitor and improve the fidelity of intervention in all grade levels. Oak Ridge Elementary leadership will facilitate monthly grade level meetings to determine instructional and behavioral support needs of all struggling students. General classroom teachers will work with ESE teachers, instructional coaches and district resource teachers to create lessons to meet the needs of all students by providing hands on lessons.

Students who are performing below grade level are discussed at MTSS meetings and are given intervention instruction. District support is provided through monthly assistance with data team meetings, problem solving and support for school leadership. Coaching Cycles – School leadership teams in partnership with director of School Improvement and district instructional coaches will develop a systemic walkthrough, and coaching cycle structure through which specific teachers and/or grade levels are identified for support. Support will be monitored for return on investment including feedback and follow-up observation of coaching plan implementation. Classroom Walkthroughs – The director of School Improvement and the School Improvement team along with FLDOE will conduct scheduled classroom walkthroughs with Oak Ridge Elementary. Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS): Oak Ridge Elementary will implement a PBIS program which is a systematic approach in teaching behavioral expectations throughout each school.

Parental Involvement

Oak Ridge Elementary - (\$1,800) Parent Communication Software - To increase parent engagement, communication software will be purchased that will allow the parents and the school to communicate with each other regarding pertinent school events, workshops, and offerings for students and families.

Incentives for Instructional Personnel

As referenced in the **K-12 ESEA Common Program Guidance**, Recruitment, retention and reward incentives must be based on a three-year aggregate state value-added model (VAM) score. If state VAM is not available, another student growth model may be proposed. The student growth model must be fair and reliable. The LEA must submit the model demonstrating the classification and distribution of non-state VAM teacher scores for approval. Incentives can be part of a structured pay system or a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU); however, the above criteria shall apply. Recruitment incentives for teachers with less than one year of experience or for hard to staff positions will be considered on a case by case basis.

Oak Ridge Elementary: Recognizes and celebrates teacher success quarterly by acknowledging teachers for students' academic growth in all subject and behavioral areas in front of their peers at faculty meetings and student assemblies to show appreciation.

STEM Day / S.N.O.W. Day - (\$3000) In order to promote connections in learning of science and math, we will host an annual S.N.O.W. (Science, Numeracy, Observation, and Wonder) Day. The entire day is devoted to providing students with educational experiences centered around STEM goals and objectives for all grade levels. Items will be purchased to cover the materials and activities for the day. (2,002.17) STEM related supplies will be purchased for all grade levels so that students can participated in STEM activities for the day. Intervention teacher units – (\$184,998.33) In an effort to provide reading interventions for tier 2 and 3 students in grades Kindergarten, first, second and fourth, the cost of three and a half teachers would be used to cover a teachers' salaries and benefits. The teachers hired for kindergarten, first and fourth will count as a whole teaching unit and the 2nd grade teacher will count as a half unit with the remaining of the salary being paid from another source. Oak Ridge Elementary: (\$28,620) Oak Ridge will implement an Academic Academy designed to provide tutoring to students beyond the school day. Students will participate in before school and after school tutoring to promote academic achievement. This will build students as continuous learners that will produce learning gains across grades three-five. We will be strategic in selecting students who will need to attend tutoring session for teacher-led instruction to increase their Level 1s to Level 2s and their Level 2s to Level 3s. Oak Ridge Elementary -(\$3,780) Oak Ridge will implement a Summer Academic Academy designed to provide tutoring to students beyond the school day. Students will participate in tutoring to promote and retain academic achievement.
