The School Advisory Council (SAC) is the committee that makes decisions on parental involvement at Sneads High School. These meetings will be four times a year: two in the fall and two in the spring. This will be measured by the adequate progress of the School Improvement Goals and objectives, and the SAC Committee's approval of the next year's Parent and Family Engagement Plan. Sneads High School follows the requirements of State Statute 1001.452 in the selection of members to serve on the SAC.
