Based on the previous school year surveys and exit slips, one of our main barriers that exist is our parent/family work schedules. This particular barrier (work hours) has been an ongoing barrier for Jupiter. However, Jupiter will continue to arrange school meetings at varied times and locations based on the parent/family schedules. Parent/teacher conferences will be scheduled at various times, by phone, or virtually with parents who are unable to attend conferences at school. Parent/family involvement curriculum nights will be scheduled only once per month as parents/families expressed that having multiple family engagement nights within one month hinders them from being able to attend them all.
How will you get feedback from parents and families about the meeting?	Parents will have the opportunity to provide feedback by completing an exit slip at the end of the meeting. Our Title 1 personnel will also be available after the meeting to answer any questions parents/families might have. We will have our exit slips in Spanish for our non-English speakers.
