Eligibility and Allocation

Eligibility

Eligibility for 2020-21 TSSSA will be based on 2019 school grades and meeting one of the following criteria: a school implementing a turnaround plan or a turnaround school that has improved to a C or higher and has exited turnaround status within the last two years.

The preliminary allocation is based on a per-FTE funding amount of \$500 or as provided by the General Appropriations Act. Districts are required to complete a district-level plan. In addition, school-level plans are also required. The district and school level plans must be submitted to your school board for approval by August 1. The school board approved plan is due to the Bureau of School Improvement no later than September 1.

Family and Community Partnerships

Explain how the school will establish comprehensive support services that develop family and community partnerships.

Metcalfe has a partnership with the Cade Museum for Creativity and Invention called Operation Full Steam. Second and third grade students have multiple visits to the Cade Museum and participate in three core experiences each visit: hands-on science labs connected to the school's science curriculum and pacing guides, dialog reading related to science curriculum facilitated by staff from Alachua County Public Library, and an introduction to coding and programming led by engineers from Sum Total Systems.

Metcalfe receives backpacks full of food for families on the weekends through the Food4Kids program sponsored by Catholic Charities.

Through the James Patterson Literacy Challenge grant, teachers receive ongoing, jobembedded professional development to enhance literacy instruction in order to better support students' language and literacy development.

Staff and tutors from the University of Florida Literacy Institute provide identified students with individualized, specially designed literacy instruction.

GatorTRAX, a group of University of Florida engineering students, provides experiences to increase the number of underrepresented students in higher-level math classes. The group is open to all students.

Kiwanis Book Club provides incentives through the BUG (Bringing Up Grades) award program. GNV4ALL has connected Metcalfe Elementary to valuable community resources.

Through a partnership with Meridan, Metcalfe female students participate in weekly after school Girls Circle meetings to help develop self-esteem and decision making.

Likewise, the United Way provides one on one reading support through their Reading Pals outreach program.

The Bread of the Mighty Food bank has created a food pantry at Metcalfe for families in need of additional food resources.

First United Methodist Church of Gainesville has partnered with Metcalfe and provides volunteers who tutor individual students 1 to 2 days per week and participate in a variety school events.

Academic and Character Standards

Explain the strategies the school will implement to establish clearly defined and measurable high academic and character standards.

Metcalfe implements PBIS with fidelity and utilizes the Character Trait of the Month. Student incentives are included and given during the Character Traits Celebrations.

The school will utilize the Caring School Community for social emotional learning. Time will be dedicated each day for this instruction.

The school will implement the Start with Hello week to promote connectedness and inclusion, and to identify and help others who are showing signs of social isolation.

Parental Involvement

Explain the strategies the school will implement to increase parental involvement and engagement in the child's education.

Metcalfe will use 2019-20 TSSSA Roll-over funds (\$5,625.00) to partially fund the salary and benefits to hire a Behavior Support Paraprofessional who will support targeted students and their families around improved behavior and attendance with the goal of increasing time spent in the classroom. The remaining portion of \$21,723.99 for the salary and benefits for the Behavior Support Paraprofessional will be covered through the 2020-2021 TSSSA funding. We will recognize those students who have improved their attendance each month. The Behavior Support Paraprofessional will be in effect August 31,2020-June16,2021 for 186 days, five days a week at \$12.31/hour.

Metcalfe will host multiple family engagement activities to include a STEM "Make it/Take it" event, "State of the School Address," and Literacy Nights. Parents will be given FSA aligned workbooks, leveled texts. Parent and Family Engagement certificates will be given for participating. 8 teachers for 9 hours of stipend (\$20/hour) to present parent and family engagement activities for a total of \$1,701.50 will be funded. STEM in Action "Make it/ Take It" kits for \$560.88 will also be funded. Other consumable supplies to support the family engagement events at a cost of \$378.91 will be provided.

Incentives for Instructional Personnel

Explain the strategies the school will implement to identify, recruit, retain, and reward instructional personnel.

As referenced in the **K-12 ESEA Common Program Guidance**, Recruitment, retention and reward incentives must be based on a three-year aggregate state value-added model (VAM) score. If state VAM is not available, another student growth model may be proposed. The student growth model must be fair and reliable. The LEA must submit the model demonstrating the classification and distribution of non-state VAM teacher scores for approval. Incentives can be part of a structured pay system or a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU); however, the above criteria shall apply. Incentives for attendance and non-instructional personnel are not allowable. Recruitment incentives for teachers with less than one year of experience or for hard to staff positions will be considered on a case by case basis.

All eligible instructional personnel at TSSSA schools for the 2020-21 school year will receive a \$2500 bonus for the purpose of recruitment and retention. To be eligible for the recruitment and retention bonus, the instructional personnel must have a Highly Effective or Effective rating for the student performance portion of their 2019-20 Instructional Appraisal. A \$1,250 payment will be made on the final pay period of December 2020 to all qualified, active instructional staff members. A second \$1,250 payment will be awarded on the last pay period

of June 2021 to all qualified, active instructional personnel at those schools. The total for incentive pay for 4 qualifying teachers is \$11,816.00. A signed MOU for this Differentiated Pay has been uploaded into the DOE Share Drive.

Only teachers with a State VAM of Highly Effective or Effective will be eligible for the bonus.

Professional Development

Explain the strategies the school will implement to provide professional development that focuses on academic rigor, direct instruction, and creating high academic and character standards.

Two days of IRLA Professional Development will be funded through Title I Part A.

Metcalfe teachers will be provided district level professional development aligned with School Improvement Goals and standards based instruction.

Focused Instruction

Explain the strategies the school will implement to provide focused instruction to improve student academic proficiency, which may include additional instruction time beyond the normal school day or school year.

Each day, Metcalfe will offer additional intensive literacy instruction to below grade level readers beyond the school day. TSSSA funds will be utilized for two teacher salaries at an hourly rate of \$30.62 and are paid for five hours of instruction and 1 hour of planning weekly. Benefits are also paid so that supplemental grant funded personnel can continue small group interventions for the additional hour of Intensive Reading Instruction at a cost of \$17,785.23. Student groups of no larger than 8 will be provided additional instruction starting August 31,2020-June 16,2021 for an hour each day.

Metcalfe has identified the area of ELA in first and second grade emergent reading skills and vocabulary as a need. Therefore, TSSSA funds will be utilized to purchase Being a Reader as a supplemental program at the cost of \$4,560, supplemental IRLA books at \$3,134.40 and IRLA School Pace web based resources at \$7,500 for student interventions. For additional vocabulary development, 125 Cobuild Dictionaries for intermediate grade level students to use during instruction will also be provided at a cost of \$3,810.49 including shipping.

The Acaletics Math program has been identified as a supplemental program to be used daily to review and reinforce math skills for all students at a cost of \$18,519.60.

As a means of building background knowledge and making real world connections with academic standards, TSSSA funds will be utilized for three educational field trips for a total cost of \$9,114.00. First and second graders will focus on science standards with a trip to the Santa Fe Teaching Zoo and Planetarium. Third grade will make real world connections with science standards by participating in the Sea World program. Fourth grade will build background knowledge and connect to social studies standards and Florida History by visiting St. Augustine.
