Parents can schedule teacher conferences as needed throughout the school year. Response to Instruction meetings will be conducted for struggling students with invitations to parents. As other activities become available, parents will be notified by monthly newsletter, web site, teachers' written communication or phone contacts. Documentation will be maintained by the Principal.
