Response: Volusia Pines Elementary has a Parent Resource Center that is open to families daily from 7:00 am to 2:30 pm. The Center provides a computer with internet access that families may use. Parents can check out books and educational materials to be used at home. Volusia Pines Elementary holds numerous family activities throughout the year to encourage families to take an active interest in their child's education. "Meet the Teacher" and "Open House" are held in August and September. At these events, parents meet teachers and learn about curriculum and expectations for the year. Parents are encouraged to volunteer in the classroom and to join PTA. Information on Title I programs are shared at the Open House using brochures and an informational PowerPoint. There is a Title I Annual Meeting at Open House. In February, Volusia Pines Elementary will host a FSA informational meeting. This event will teach parents how to help their children and assist them in preparing for FSA.
