Response: The Community Involvement Specialist (CIS) facilitates a warm and inviting Parent Resource Center for parents. The hours of operation are from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm whereby parents are given the opportunity to ask questions and utilize the computer if needed. Also, school wide pamphlets are available to keep them informed of available opportunities to learn for themselves and in support of their students.

Response: Parents receive letters, connect-ed messages, and messages are displayed on the school marquee to communicate pertinent Title I information. Parents will be invited to attend regular PTSA meetings whereby academic information will be shared. Tri-lingual parent workshops are offered to parents regarding student academic progress and assessment information. Moreover, weekly parent/teacher conferences are held to accommodate parent concerns regarding academic progess, behavioral issues and assessment information.

Translators are provided during parent workshops and meetings while bilingual staff members are available to translate during conferences and family involvement nights.

The school is accessible to all individuals, including those with disabilities, as it is equipped with an elevator and multiple ramp entrances. Parents are notified about events in writing and orally, thereby allowing full access to those with visual or audio-logical

impairments.

Ninety percent of the school population is of Haitian descent; therefore, all parent correspondences will be translated into Haitian-Creole. Information sent home to parents (e.g., flyers, calendars, etc.) and connect-ed messages will be completed in English, Spanish and Creole.
