This program is provided to all qualifying students. The objective of this program is to develop English language proficiency in the areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing. During English for Speakers of the development of English language proficiency, students progress through the beginning. 3 Other intermediate and advanced levels with the assistance of the ESOL Paraprofessional and Languages classroom teacher. The program called Rosetta Stone is being used to assist the students to learn English. This program can be accessed at home as well. Directions are sent home to (ESOL) parents to explain how to use the program.
