Response: A parent newsletter was mailed to all students two weeks prior to the start of the 2015-16 school year. This mailer included general information necessary for a smooth start to the school year. In addition, information

regarding the Open House/Meet the Teacher night was included and followed up with a ParentLink Automated Phone Message.

During the Open House, held the week before the start of the school year, parents met in the gym and learned about expectations, uniform policy and were introduced to the staff. Then they visited classrooms where teachers gave out information about the general school program, curriculum, classroom procedures, assessments being used, and how to support their child at home. In addition to the classroom information, parents received the school and district parent handbook which outlines information regarding Monroe's status as a Title 1 school, student planners and listing of contact persons at the school, including Administrative Team, Guidance and Team Leaders.

During the first quarter of the school year, we held the Annual Title 1 parent meetings to offer information regarding the National, State and District Title 1 policies. To accommodate parents unable to attend, information was sent home with students in the days following each meeting and followed up by a ParentLink call. Information was also shared at PTSA meetings.

Conference Nights are also designed to inform parents about curriculum and assessment issues. Personal invitations are sent via phone calls, notes home, flyers as well as the school web site, school radio station, newsletters and listing on the school marquee.

All parents are offered the opportunity to participate on committees in the school.
