Each grade level has prepared a parent/student friendly curriculum document. After initial STAR Reading and Math and other assessments are administered, student data chats are held with all students in grades 3-8. Parent data chats are scheduled during and after school hour times. In the event a parent cannot attend after school hours, a daytime meeting is scheduled. This procedure will repeat after the mid-year progress monitoring assessments.

Child Study Team meetings and parent conferences are encouraged throughout the

school year. Teachers contact parents via email, phone, and notes to make sure parents are informed of their child's progress or need for additional assistance.
