Response: The Title I Committee, which establishes a membership that includes the School Improvement Facilitator, Parent Educator, administration, parents, teachers, and staff, will be the main means EES will use to involve parents in the planning, review, revising, and improvement of the Title I programs in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner. A teacher representative from each grade level is requested for membership. Parents are selected for this committee through staff nominations and parent interest forms completed at Open House in August. This survey of parent's interests is also sent home with students for those who didn't attend Open House, and is collected by the Parent Educator. Eastside's school administrator will select representatives. The Eastside Parent Educator will contact and invite those parents to become year long members of the Title I Committee and/or the Family Involvement Team. The FIT members meet five times beginning in September while the Title I Committee meets a minimum of seven times a year. Review of these programs with parents and educators using data from parent surveys will focus on the planning, and improvement for the next school year. Procedures for membership will be as follows: 1. Parent survey volunteering for committees; 2. Teacher nominating a parent from classroom; 3. Phone call to parent confirming nomination; 4. Membership of all Title I funded positions at EES; and 5. Each department will select a team member to represent their team. Additional meetings, above the regularly scheduled meetings, are held for final checklist approval and technical assistance provided by the district Title I office. Response: The Title I Family Center is the hub for planning all Title I sponsored parent activities at Eastside. Two weeks before a Parent Involvement activity the Parent Educator will begin notification to targeted grade level, targeted subject area, or district/school level activity to inform parents. Flyers, school automated phone system, stickers in planners, and other advertisement medium maybe used to keep parents informed. Families feel welcome to come and visit the Family Center, ask questions about school related problems or look for academic materials while their student is in school. The Family Center is open one night a week to accommodate working parents and will use referral forms ((RX's) from teachers to help find specific academic materials to be used at home with parent help. The Parent Educator also may offer a meeting place for parents who may want to discuss questions they have about the various aspects of Title I, FCAT, SES, or AYP, and they do not want to discuss it in a large group. At teachers' request a home visit may be arranged to assist parent involvement in meeting the needs of the child.
