The parents also received the school and district parent handbook which included detailed information regarding our Title I School.

On October 31, 2013, we will hold our annual Title I meeting to disseminate information regarding National, State, and District Title I polices. Parents who are unable to attend will receive the information in a packet sent home the next day. We will continue to provide additional information throughout the school year.

Curriculum will be explained to parents during the Back to School Bash, content area curriculum nights/Saturdays, and assessment breakfasts. Conference nights will also be utilized to explain curriculum and assessment. Personal invitations will be sent to parents through phone calls, flyers, and newsletters to invite them to participate in decision making committees such as SAC and PTA.
