Response: Memorial Elementary School welcomes parents to our school in a friendly, professional manner. Parents can also use our school website to gain valuable information regarding our school's activities. The guidance counselor is available to parents of students who struggle academically or behaviorally. The counselor works with parents to develop a plan they can use at home to help strengthen performance at school. Parents can also access resources through the district office designed to support efforts at home. MES also sends home monthly newsletters that contain information about how to help at home and calendar items that alert parents to upcoming opportunities to be involved at school.

Response: An Open House will be held in August where parents can receive bus, lunch. and dress code information. Memorial Elementary School will host an annual meeting in September to present information regarding the Title One Program. Parents can also meet with their child's teacher and receive information on parent/teacher conferences. the class curriculum, assessment plans, and strategies parents can use to help their child at home. Sign-in sheets will be used to document these activities. Teachers will also have a face-to-face conference to sign the compact statements outlining the student's expectations, the parent's expectations, and the teacher's expectations. These compacts will be kept for documentation. Kindergarten students have taken home folders to keep parents informed of daily assignments and 1st through 5th grade students use planners for this purpose. School Advisory Council meetings are held each month where information about the school and the progress being made is reported along with other items. Monthly newsletters featuring helpful hints and calendar items are sent home as well.
