School's History & Demographics:

Built in 1974, Eagle Lake Elementary school has 28 classroom teachers, 4 resource teachers, 10 paraprofessionals and 11 other staff. The enrollment data collected in spring 2016 was 540 students. Of this total enrollment, 19.5% African-American, 44.9% white, and 32.5% Hispanic.



<u>Title I Information</u>: 100% of students receive free breakfast and lunch allowing us to qualify for Federal Assistance through TITLE I. Based on our Title I budget, \$ 2,171.93 is required to be spent on Parent Involvement. Parent input is collected as to how these funds will be spent.
