Response: The regular classroom teachers meets with parents throughout the year to look at the data of their child and to make suggestions on how they can help their child at home. We provide several means of communication for both the teachers and parents to communicate. We use a call out system where the messages are in both English and Spanish. We also purchased student planners so there can be open communication. The use of Remind messaging system, DoJo app, and Facebook are ways that the school is continue to update our communication efforts.

The classroom teacher also makes referrals for parents to meet with our Reading Coach on a one-on-one basis to help provide ideas and assistance to review the needs of their child and to give suggestions to parents on how to help their child.

We have an ELL paraprofessional who has created several resources for our teachers to be able to communicate in Spanish. All notes are already created and teachers have direct access to notes in the binder. The ELL paraprofessional also meets with teachers and parent to communicate and bridge the language barrier. We also have a school liaison that assit with meetings and translations of letters.

Meetings occur throughout the year to provide parents the opportunity to participate in a question and answer session related to decisions in their child's education. Flexible meeting times can be scheduled during teacher planning period or after school; For parents with computer access, email is a quick way to communicate with teachers. Many academic decisions for our students are discussed at our School Improvement Meetings. Although we follow the guidelines of voting members, we invite all parents to attend these meetings. It is schedule on our calendar that goes out to all parents.
