Parents Right-To-Know

As a parent of a Title I student, you have the right to know the following information of your child's teacher and paraprofessional:

- Whether the teacher has meet State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications
- Information on the level of achievement. FLVS FT does not employ paraprofessionals to work with students.
- Notice to parent if child is being taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a non-highly qualified teacher
