During the SIP draft review, FGPA's academic coaches are present to address any questions or concerns the SAC team may have. FGPA's SAC team's recommendations that are then added prior to final approval of the SIP. Parent, Business Partner, and Community member's suggestions are documented in the SAC minutes. We maintain a Parent Suggestion Box in the front office which will be monitored weekly by the Lead Teacher to obtain additional recommendations.
