Response: Kissimmee Elementary provide time and space for the Parent Resource Centers to be available to all parents on campus. The Title I Mobile Parent Center provides resources to all the parents of KES. The Title I Mobile Lab is available on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the Month from 12:30-2:30. Parents may borrow up to three supplemental educational items from the school for two weeks; these materials can be viewed on-line or in person.

The leadership team completes the in-house Title I check list prior to each family event. This ensures that proper advertisement and communication is fulfilled. It also ensures that flyers and advertisements are completed in a timely manner.

In order to monitor the parent participation in events, all facilitators use sign-in sheets.

Response: Kissimmee Elementary will encourage parents to attend our Meet & Greet event scheduled for August 8, 2016 from 3:00 - 6:00 pm and will give out parent handbooks on the first day of school, August 10, 2016. We will also be holding a conference night in October 2016. At that time receive specific information on the Florida Standards and curriculum, assessment plans, and information on how the parents can help their children at home.

During weekly department and grade level meetings, faculty and staff are directed to continue updating all stakeholders and complete proper forms when scheduling events or activities.

Title I booklets and District PIP were provided to the parents in the first day packets. Additionally, the student agenda contains a summary of the Parent Involvement Plan and School Compact. Every new student registering receives a copy of all this material. A Title I menu to access links to Title I information is available through the school's website.

KES will hold a general meeting for parents during the Annual Meeting in September 2016. The meeting will be held both during the day and at night on different days to accommodate parent schedules. During that meeting parents will be informed about the Title I Program that KES provides. Curriculum and academic assessments will be explained. Parents will also receive information on how to schedule parent/teacher conferences as well as opportunities to participate in volunteer activities within the school.

Curriculum being used at the school is addressed at the school SAC and PTO meetings. Also, grade levels review the curriculum at the Open House with parents. Technology links are available directly on the KES website for parent access. FOCUS, also on our website, provides parents with a direct link to their child's current grades, attendance, and behavior.

Any parent can request a conference with the teacher but must give at least 24 hours notice for preparation time for the teacher. Both in-person and phone conferences are available. Parents may contact teachers via the agenda, phone, or their school district email address to discuss work and behaviors.

SAC Committee is for both parents and teachers to work together in helping evaluate the School Improvement Plan and to help generate other ideas for programs to help to achieve our school plan. It also allows monthly updates on the administrative side of school issues from the curriculum to testing to behaviors and even great achievements by students and staff.

ESE, ESOL, MTSS and 504 parent meetings are held at least annually in order to update and document student learning goals and gains in their specified work area.

End of the year survey is open for parents to take and results are presented to the SAC committee.

Response: A monthly newsletter, "The Bear Facts" is distributed to all parents and business partners in English and Spanish. All school-wide parent communications, announcements, meetings and activities are also provided in both languages. Parents are also asked to watch the school marquee for information and are directed to the KES school web site where an internet based calendar of activities is available. The school has one marquee in the front to post dates and times of important events.

KES provides agendas for all students which are utilized in grades K - 5 for daily parent communication. The Title I Compact is provided to parents at the beginning of the school year and is printed in English and Spanish. Labels are placed in agendas for announcements. We also utilize an out-dial feature on our phone system to call students' homes, disseminating information to parents in English and in Spanish. Regular emails are sent to staff to ensure all information is sent to students on a regular basis.

Parents are provided regular reports of academic progress through report cards, progress reports, and completed assignments. Invitations to attend school meetings and conferences go home in the students' agendas and are provided in both languages. Regular meetings are encouraged as follow up to the strategies outlined to check progress. If an interpreter is required, several bilingual staff members are available to assist.

The school PIP will be summarized and a copy of the summary will be sent home to all parents. The PIP will be posted on the schools website in its entirety as well as a hard copy available in the office.

When applicable, the district special needs staff are available to assist parents with mobility concerns, as well as with sight and hearing disabilities.
