Response: At the annual Title I orientation meeting held on September 27th, 2016, Homestead Senior High School provided parents with information on the curricular opportunities available to their children as well as information on academic assessments. Parents learned about school-wide programs, how to schedule parent conferences and days when the school is open for walk-in parent conferences, and opportunities for participation in decisions related to the education of their child. Upon conclusion of the general meeting, parents were invited to visit their child's classroom and meet the staff. During the classroom visits, teachers provided additional information on the course, assessment plans, and how parents can help their child at home. The school's website will be maintained to reflect current information for parents, including a calendar of activities and events. Additionally, parents will be encouraged to download the HSHS APP as well as the MDCPS APP.
