Nominations are reviewed and candidates selected by demographic status. All parents are encouraged, invited, and welcomed to attend SAC meetings to participate in the planning, review, and improvement of the annual Title I program. A Title I annual meeting is conducted in September to discuss the Title I school wide project, Parent/Family Engagement Plan, Home-School Compact and opportunities for parents to be engaged in their child's education. The Assistant Principal is responsible for planning the Title 1 annual meeting. A Spanish speaking staff member serves on SAC and translates, as needed, at all meetings. In November 2017, Sun 'n Lake Elementary will host Veteran's Day activities, which is open to the public to honor those who have and are actively serving our country. We will have an agenda of activities for the day.

The 7 Habits Leadership Day was conducted last year and will be undertaken this year in Spring 2018. Parents will be counted with a R.S.V.P. and a sign in sheet. We will also provide an agenda for the day.

Every parent will receive a copy of the Home School Compact in English or Spanish at the fall report card conference. The form will be discussed individually for each child and parent. We provide Spanish translation when needed for all school activities.

At ORIENTATION in August 2017, teachers will preview the curriculum for the school year. During Grade Level Curriculum Nights in September, parents will receive detailed information about the curriculum and Florida State Standards. At the Report Card conferences in Oct./Nov. 2017 and April 2018, teachers will communicate the progress of the child in each curriculum area. Teachers will send home bi-weekly newsletters to keep parents informed. Sun 'n Lake sends home a bi-monthly newsletter in English and in Spanish if needed. A Home/School Communication Folder organizes the sharing of information between home and school. School event flyers are sent home in English and Spanish. Parents receive notifications for events via the Sun 'n Lake newsletter, Remind 101 text, call out and Facebook.

The FSA assessments are explained in a SAC meeting when a full disclosure of scores are available from the state. Written material is available for parents. All parents receive notification of the GRADE status of the school.

Parent input, visits to school, phone calls, and emails are encouraged by administration and teachers. Coverage is provided so that teachers can meet with parents during the school day if needed.

All Title 1 correspondence will be housed in the Title 1 notebook for review if parents wish to review materials. The Assistant Principal will be in charge of the Title 1 notebook and will monitor that the information is provided.

The school uses Facebook as an effective tool to promote events at the school, communicate, and answer questions from parents and the community.
