Westside Elementary will implement the following activities:

Parent Resource Room will be open where parents may check out materials to be used at home in support of reading, math, science, and writing. Student packets will be available upon request for additional practice in math and reading.

Spring Fling -PTO will sponsor a springtime festival partnered with community and business members along with parents. The event invites families into the school to participate in fun activities and will foster a positive school to home connection.

Book Fairs- The Media Specialist will host Book Fairs for students, parents and teachers to attend. Each Book fair will include an after hours event for parents and students.

Family Reading Nights- the Media Specialist will hold Family Reading Nights to provide parents the opportunity to learn literacy strategies and read with their child. Students may take Accelerated Reader quizzes during this time. A computer will be available in the Media Center for parent use.

Literacy Week will support reading. Volunteers will be scheduled to come into the school to read to the students.

Newsletter - biweekly publications will be sent home to enhance communication between school and home, and to include tips for parents to use at home to help their children with reading and math.

School Website will be updated regularly for parents to access school events and important dates and to keep them informed on current reading, writing, math, and science standards.

Ongoing workshops/meetings will be held to address and discuss parent concerns, support reading and math, and answer any parent questions. These workshops will be based on parent input gathered from surveys given in the spring.

PTO Meetings- Parents will have the opportunity to participate in theses monthly meetings where information is provided about activities that are occurring on campus and ways that parents can become more involved at school. The meetings also provide opportunities for parents to receive information and strategies on how to help their students at home with academics.

Information on Title 1 programs will be made available to parents at Open House and Annual Title 1 meetings which occur in the fall. The Annual Title 1 Meeting will be held at 3 varying times so that all parents have an increased opportunity to attend.

Information will be made available throughout the year via the school website and newsletters which are distributed twice each month.

A description of the curriculum, assessments and grade level expectations that are used to measure student progress and proficiency levels will be made available in the District Pupil Progression Plan.

Student and school assessment results will be shared at conferences. Student Compacts will be signed and used as a means to aide in understanding of student achievement and enhance parent teacher communication. Student Compacts will include comparison graphs which will help parents understand their child's progress and proficiency in reading and math (Performance Matter and iReady).

Progress Reports are sent home the middle of each grading period. Report cards will be sent home at the end of each nine week grading period to inform parents of student's classroom grades, conduct, and work habitat.

SAC meetings will be held in which parents may participate in the decisions relating to the education of their children.

A Title 1 Notebook will be available in the school office. It will contain information on state standards, testing schedules, Title 1 requirements, Parents' Right to Know, The Complaint Process, Principal Attestation, and information on Title VI, Title II and the SIG Grants.

Informative handouts on the above will be available at the Annual Title 1 Meeting and Open House in the fall. Request for further information can be made via a parent request form contained in the Title I Notebook which will be located in the front office.

When applicable, all mailings, Title I information and school documents will be made available to parents in English. Other languages are available upon request. Parent conferences and meetings will be translated as needed. Family workshops will be translated as needed. The PFEP will be posted on the school's website. If needed, American Sign Language and Braille translations can be provided for those families who would benefit from the services.

Westside will provide opportunities both during and after school to encourage parent involvement. Activities will be advertised on the school marquee, school newsletter, automated callout system, Remind101, and through notes or flyers sent home with students. Remind101 and the automated school messenger phone call out system will be used to promote family involvement activities. A monthly newsletter is distributed to all parents. We also utilize the school agendas and take home folders in grades K-5 for announcements and parent communication.

Parents are also provided regular reports of academic progress through report cards, progress reports and weekly progress on completed assignments.

Invitations to school meetings and conferences go home by backpacks. If needed a Progress Monitoring Plan is developed between the teacher and parent. Regular meetings are encouraged as follow up to the

strategies outlined to check on progress. If an interpreter is required, assistance from the District will be requested.
