Title I Annual Meeting and Open House Minutes Thursday, September 11, 2014 Seagull Academy for Independent Living

Tours of classrooms and discussions with teachers took place from 5:00-5:45

The meeting came to order at 6:00 pm.

Director of Education, Linda Moore, welcomed Parents, students and guests.

Ms. Moore introduced the SAIL Staff and provided a description of their positions at the school.

Ms. Moore verified that everyone received a raffle ticket, as prizes would be given at the end of the evening.

A calendar of important dates was distributed and discussed. The calendar included days off, LTM/early release days, special events for SAIL.

Special Olympics information was discussed and parents were encouraged to support their students. Students registered for Bowling have had the opportunity to train once per week on Fridays. Students who register for Basketball will be training at the Therapeutic Rec Center starting in October. SAIL has increased our support of student athletes this year by offering practice time once per week.

Ms. Moore discussed SAIL's policies on: dress code, bullying, cell phones, field trips.

Lead Teacher, Aaron Rudy gave a presentation on Education City, an online learning opportunity for students. This year SAIL is offering access to online school activities at home. Students will be allowed to login and access reading, math, or science sections in the form of games and direct teaching. He then gave a demonstration on how to access this website and log in.

Purpose

What is Title 1

Levels learning playing field to increase achievement of all students. Main goal is working with parents and students to increase desire to learn and succeed.

Qualifying for Title 1

Title I schools are provided additional funding to supplement their educational plan. Schools qualify by having at least 59.9% of students on free or reduced lunch. There are 90,000 Title I students in Palm Beach County.

Title 1 Iniatives at Seagull Academy

\$355/student who are 18 and under. \$5637 is our funding for 2014-2015. We break it down into family involvement \$90 towards subscription to a quarterly newsletter, \$555 for staff development, \$4992 towards a paraprofessional salary.

Title 1 Schoolwide Plan

Seagull Academy is committed to working with entire family to ensure student success.

All parents are invited to review the Title 1 documents and provide input.

Friday is field trip day. Educational and cultural opportunities are offered as well as sports training for Special Olympics.

SAIL encourages all parents to get involved in some way. Volunteering is welcome as is participation in school events such as the Spaghetti Dinner and Prom Committee.

SAIL announced increased after school programs such as Best Buddies of Palm Beach, with an emphasis on art and music, the Suncoast Culinary Program, and internships.

SAIL also supports teachers and paraprofessionals by offering Professional Development opportunities throughout the year.

Parents' Right To Know

It was explained that parents have the right to know the professional qualifications of their student's teachers and paraprofessionals providing services to their child. It was also explained that they will be notified in writing if their child has been assigned to a teacher or has been taught by a teacher for more than four consecutive weeks, who is not highly qualified.

All SAIL staff are highly Qualified. Bachelor's degree, subject area exam, state certification for teachers. HS Diploma, GED, 2 years of college, para assessment test for paras.

Parent Involvement Policy Plan (PIP)

Parents were asked for input into the PIP. SAIL produced a survey/questionnaire in order to get participation and feedback from parents.

Comments were very favorable. Parents really like the after school programs as well as the community involvement opportunities SAIL offers in the form of internships and field trips.

Parents were asked for their support of our new after school programs. 3-5 student will have the opportunity to enhance their job skills as part of the Suncoast Culinary Program. Transportation will need to be arranged by the family.

Parent assistance and support will also be needed for The Spaghetti Supper.

We will continue to provide activities to help parents improve their children's academic achievement. Another Open House will take place in January, where parents will be invited to SAIL.

School-Parent Compact

Parents were asked for input into the School-Parent Compact, which is our agreement with the parent, student, and school. SAIL produced a survey/questionnaire in order to get participation and feedback from parents.

The Compact recognizes the shared responsibility of Seagull Academy, parents/guardians, and students to foster high student academic and vocational achievement.

Parents will be provided information in a language and format which is easy to understand. We now have two paraprofessionals on staff who speak Spanish and Creole.

Offering additional afterschool programs to benefit students – such as Best Buddies and Suncoast Culinary Program, and Special Olympics.

There was a question and answer period. There was more detailed discussion about the new after school programs and internships.

SAIL Surveys were collected and raffle prizes were awarded. Refreshments were served.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30pm.
