- a. Beginning of school packets will go home in September. This packet will include the district and school level parent involvement plan, parent rights, Title 1 Home-School Compact, and other resources for parents. Parents will sign a cover letter that accompanies this packet and return to school to indicate that they have received these documents.

School-wide monthly newsletters, weekly school newsletters (per class) and school-wide monthly Parent-Involvement newsletters will be distributed to students to take home in their folders/backpacks. Before any Title I meetings, a flyer and a reminder (phone home) will be sent home with students in folders/backpacks.
