Response: The Title I committee works in conjunction with the School Advisory Council, the Parent Leadership Council, and the Board of the PTA to review, plan, and improve school programs, including the parental involvement plan (PIP). The school administration provides flyers and Connect Orange calls for meetings to encourage participation. The annual SAC retreat is a time designed for collaboration with parents on the upcoming school year's budgetary issues, this is the forum for parents to give input on where money should be spent and what types of workshops would be helpful in increasing parental participation. Our monthly SAC/PTA/PI meetings also involve the parents in the decision making process on budgetary issues as well as reminding all staff and parents of the purpose and requirements of being a Title I school. The Title I budget and funding breakdown is explained to all parents and all staff at the Annual Title I meeting. Parents, teachers, staff and community members are asked for suggestions for utilizing funds and for creating programs that increase parent involvement. At the annual meeting parents and staff are asked for their input on the two separate surveys-one for parent professional development and one for overall Title I program implementation. The school newsletter also informs parents and staff about Title I programs offered at the school. There is a suggestion box in the office for parents to give feedback and suggestions on a daily basis and the Title I representative brings these suggestions to the SAC/PTA/PI meetings, where action can be taken with parental involvement. The school website also includes ways in which parents and other stakeholders can offer input into Title I programs. Teachers communicate daily with parents through a daily communication log. Teachers write about daily activities and celebrate student successes. Parents can ask and answer questions concerning their child's daily activities at school.

School social worker is a constant resource to parents ensuring that they have transportation, information and outside services for themselves and the student.
