

These groups meet several times, sometimes monthly, throughout the school year and work with the principal to review data and determine school needs, including the use of Title I funds. As members leave the PFEP team, new members will be recruited and trained. We have a volunteer program in which parents and community members are invited and encouraged to participate in student learning activities. Among these are classroom reading partners and the Family Reading & Resource Center.

March 23, 2018 was a PFEP training. We reviewed our PIP and wrote our action plan for the 2018-2019 agenda. Sign-in sheets and minutes will be maintained in the Title I Monitoring box.

Parents provide feedback on scheduling through the annual parent meeting and annual parent survey. To be flexible, the PTO meets monthly with meetings scheduled on a rotating basis. Children are allowed to attend with their parents. The Family Reading & Resource Center is open 90 minutes before school begins, for those parents who need to get to work. Children are encouraged to attend with their parents. SAC meetings are held six times a year at various times to accommodate parents' schedules,

and children may come with their parents. Parent-teacher conferences are held before school, during teacher planning times, and after school.

Our Title I AFA has a family-friendly room located just beyond our lobby door. It is open Wednesdays and Fridays before school. The AFA paraprofessional III maintains a database of participants. She provides helpful information for our families such as how to help children (toddlers and older) learn to love reading, how to organize family evenings, how to help children with math, and more.

On Wednesdays, our school social worker provides information to students, staff, and parents about community resources that support education. Documentation is maintained in the Title I monitoring box and FOCUS/EDIS portal.
