Back to School Dance and Book Fair	The Back to School Dance allows families to become part of our community of learners. While attending they can go to the media center and select books from the book fair for their students. Instructional staff are available to assist them in finding right fit books.		
Grandparents Day	Grandparents are invited to have lunch with their grandchildren and learn how students are taught to make good nutritional decisions about lunch choices.		
SAC/ Monthly	Parents are invited to attend monthly SAC Meetings to learn about the progress of the school and how to become more involved.		
PTO/ Monthly	Parents are invited to attend monthly PTO Meetings. These meetings help them engage in school community and learn how to support the school programs.		
Spaghetti Dinner/ Annual Title I meeting	The dinner allows families to become part of our community of learners. At that event we will conduct our Annual Title I meeting.		
Rockin' Reading Night	This event is an opportunity for parents to learn reading strategies to use at home.		
Student Led Conferences (2X/year)	Student Led Conferences are held to have students share their progress with parents. Teachers can make recommendations for how to support from home.		
Parkway Treasures Night (3x/year)	Parents are encouraged to participate in school events, sign planners, and support at home reading. Each time they do this they earn points. If they earn 80% of the possible points per quarter they get a Parents' Night Out and we keep the students for 2 hours.		
CSI Night	Parents and families attend to learn about investigating like a scientist. This event allows demonstration of scientific thinking.		
FSA Parent Nights	These nights share information about the FSA testing and how parents can support their students from home.		
Parkway & The Arts	This night is a demonstration of students' art work. Students are able to explain how they express themselves artistically. Parents		

Family Trivia Night	Families will participate in an academic Trivia Game. They will learn more about the grade level standards their students are focusing on in the classrooms.
