All current and new families receive a Title I brochure explaining Title One; Information/links to Website, Parent Information and their "Right to Know", Parent Literacy nights, monthly newsletter. Title One information is translated into native languages of families. Translators are available at parent night activities.

All teachers are required to contact parents during the first two weeks of school to introduce themselves to the families. All teachers are required to hold a Parent Night informing them of the class and grade level expectations by the third week of school. All teachers are required to hold mid-year parent/teacher/student conferences to discuss the child's academic achievements and goals. Staff arrange for interpreters, as needed. Conferences take place before and after school and during teacher planning time on campus. Phone conferences are mandated if meeting cannot be accomplished. Social worker makes a home visit if teachers were not successful in communicating with parents.

The School Improvement Plan will be developed and approved at September SAC meeting. School Choice information will be provided during December's SAC meeting. STEAM Family Engagement Nights will be provided to students and parents throughout the 2018-2019 school year. Furthermore, SAC will include parents in the decision making process involving educational issues at the school.

Response: Language barriers exist at some events for families who do not speak English. Working parents are unable to get to school regularly for evening programs. Evening events often make feeding a family difficult. Notification needs to be multi-faceted in order to remind families of events/opportunities.

Response: Materials will be translated for ESOL families. Interpreters will be provided for conferences and parent meetings. Spacing programs throughout the year and at varied times, allow more families to participate. Food is provided by a business partner for all family engagement events free of charge to encourage more participation. Additionally, classes are being offered in the morning after drop-off to encourage parents to stay for learning.
