For parents who are unable to come to the school the Social Worker, SAFE Coordinators, and Evans Resource Teacher make home visits for attendance and academic purposes.

Parent, teacher, administration, student conferences are scheduled to accommodate parents in the morning, after-school, and early evening.

The School Advisory Council (SAC) and Parent, Teacher, Student Association (PTSA) is scheduled monthly in the early evening and the dates for the entire year are distributed at the beginning of the school year. Orientations are scheduled in early evening.

Because of a strong belief in the importance of parental engagement Evans implemented a Parent Resource Center which is open during the school day both in the morning, afternoon, after-school and scheduled evenings to provide parents with flexible times to access informational and computer resources, as well as, workshops and family engagement activities.
