MTSS (RtI) team meetings will be conducted for struggling students with parents being an integral part of the team. Parents can schedule teacher conferences as needed throughout the school year. As other activities become available, parents will be notified by monthly newsletter, activity fliers, website, teachers' written communication, School Messenger, or phone contacts.
