The school is holding multiple events that will allow for parent involvement related directly to core subjects. The Family Science/STEM night will allow parents and students an opportunity to learn about various science standards to enhance science knowledge. The Arts Integration Night will allow parents an opportunity to see and experience activities that will show how PAFA integrates the arts into literacy, math, and science to provide a well-rounded curriculum. The Family Literacy Night will allow for application of literacy standards through hands-on activities. Parents will also learn strategies to encourage reading at home with their child. Math Family Night will allow for parents to learn ways to incorporate games and activities utilizing math standards to reinforce academics.

At the beginning of the school year, Open House allows parents to visit the school and view its resources. Welcome Back Packets are provided to all students that includes a Title I booklet, District LEA Parent & Family Engagement Plan Summary and School Parent & Family Engagement Plan Summary. Every new student that is enrolled throughout the year is provided a copy of the packet upon registration. In addition, a Title I menu to access links to Title I is available through the school's website.

Curriculum being used at the school is addressed at the school SAC and PTO meetings. At our Title I Annual Meeting, a PowerPoint is shared with the parents and families regarding information on the standards the child is expected to achieve, what the child is learning, how the children are being evaluated, and how to get in touch with the teacher.

A Title I survey is sent home to parents in order to get feedback on curriculum, testing, barriers, etc. All surveys are collected and evaluated. We use a marquee system in the front of the school to communicate important dates and events. We also utilize flyers, student agendas, and posters to advertise about family engagement activities as well as social media avenues (website, Twitter, and Facebook). Our school has an outdial system called School Messenger that is used to contact parents in regard to emergencies. Automated messages are provided in English and Spanish. Osceola County School District has a virtual backpack website that parents can visit in order to see the various community businesses that are involved with the district schools and areas.

There is school wide parent communication with the use of handbooks, announcements, meetings, and activities which are provided in English and Spanish. #### **Barriers**

During the Title I annual parent meeting we provide all parents with the PowerPoint in English, as well as a paper copy in Spanish. This helps any parents who may have a language barrier. We also have a translator available to answer any questions they may have or to give us any input they may have. During our building events, we have volunteers that speak Spanish to assist or explain the activities for the parents who need that to be able to participate. For the time constraints, we make sure to schedule our events on different days of the week and certain events are offered at varying times of the day. For parents who are struggling with their work schedule, we offer different nights of the week. We will provide a calendar of projected events at the beginning of each semester to allow parents to plan for the event in advance.
