## Flexible Parent Meetings

<u>Walker Elementary School</u> will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds provided under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

Walker Elementary School will schedule meetings to be held at various times during the school day or evening to better accommodate parents. explanations of homework and grading procedures. The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of statewide assessment systems, standards, promotion criteria, and other accountability measures. The school will host several academic literacy trainings where childcare will be provided.
