Reading Night at 2 separate locations on 2 different nights. Approx. 200 parents and students in attendance.

Science Night, in cooperation with the Boys and Girls Club of Central Florida, held at the school cafeteria, and featuring the group Mad Science. We had approximately 75 parents and students in attendance.

Math Night was held in 2 separate locations on 2 different nights with an attendance of 82 parents and families.

We hosted a screening of the movie "Resilience" to introduce families to the problems of acute childhood trauma and how trauma informed care can assist students who have experienced trauma in their lives.
