Involvement of Parents

Parents will be provided with materials and directions of how they can reinforce instruction at home. Our school will provide a workshop each year where statewide assessment systems, standards, and other accountability measures are discussed. Our school holds several parent literacy nights (for all grade levels) where childcare is provided.
