Flexible Parent Meetings

<u>Discovery Elementary School</u> will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds provided under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)

Meetings will be held at various time during the day or evening to better accommodate parents. Our school will hold an orientation for parents at each grade level to inform them about the school's participation in the Title I program and to encourage parents to be involved with reviewing and revising of the School's Title I Parent Involvement Plan. Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms. Parents will be given a summary of the students' test scores and explanation of the interventions that teachers are using to assist the child in accomplishing achievement goals. Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures. The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of statewide assessment systems, standards, and other accountability measures. Also, the school will host a Parent University with various sessions. These sessions will consist of parent workshops focusing on a variety of topics where childcare will be provided.
