# SAWGRASS SPRINGS MIDDLE SCHOOL School-Level Parent and Family Engagement Plan 2019-2020

## Mission Statement

The Sawgrass Springs Middle School faculty and staff is dedicated to providing an innovative educational program in which all students will be actively engaged in learning, through an integrated environmental curriculum, incorporating the most recent technology, in a clean, safe, environment where students will experience academic and personal growth.

## Involvement of Parents

Sawgrass Springs Middle School will involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner, in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs including involvement in the decisions regarding how funds for parental involvement will be used [Sections1118(c)(3), 1114(b)(2), and 1118(a)(2)(B)].

Parents are involved in the Title I program through monthly parent activities that begin early in the year with our Open House for all grades. Parents had a copy of their children class schedule and visited classrooms and talked to each teacher. 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Open House will take place on 9/10/2019 and 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> Grades on 9/11/2019. These meetings inform parents of the many components of the Title I program, introduce them to the school's curriculum and various assessments in each subject area, and recruit parents to become part of the school's decision-making process.

We plan to combine PTSA, SAC and TITLE I Family Nights into one evening to maximize participation and continue to be successful in providing parents a forum for participation in an organized, ongoing and timely manner. Parents have the opportunity to attend staggered activities that involve them on several levels. SAC meetings throughout the year offer parents a vehicle for input into how parental involvement funds are used, what items should be included in the Title I Home-School Compact and Annual Title I Parent Survey, and keeps parents informed as to the implementation of the School Improvement Plan.

Sawgrass Springs Middle School's Parent Newsletter and Sawgrass Springs Web site contain a "Title I Corner" to keep parents up-to-date on Title I issues and various ways to communicate with the school. A special "Title I Bulletin" is sent home via backpack with all students to inform parents as to the location of the school and district Parent Involvement Policies and ways to access the School Improvement Plan. This information is also posted on our website in the Title I section. The school's website contains an extensive section on Title I activities and features monthly parent night gatherings with photographs and news releases.

## Coordination and Integration

## Flexible Parent Meetings

Sawgrass Springs Middle School will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with Title I funds, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services related to Parental Involvement [Section 1118(c)(2)].

Parent conferences are scheduled in the morning hours 5 days a week and offer flexibility in time slots. ESE parent meetings are conducted not only in the morning, but also throughout the day to provide convenience for parents. The social worker makes home visits where needed. PTSA/SAC/Title I Parent Nights will be conducted regularly on the same evening, so parents have an opportunity to participate in all or selected events. SAC parents have approved this collaboration for several years and point to it as a "best practice" that has increased parent involvement in Title I parent-student activities. Complimentary childcare and food are provided at each PTSA/SAC/Title I parent night activity. Some teams conduct parent "coffee chats" each quarter in the morning before school begins to discuss progress monitoring of students. Interims are passed out at that time, a day in advance of the school distribution, to afford parents a one-on-one opportunity to discuss strengths and weakness with team teachers.

## Communication

Sawgrass Springs Middle School will provide parents of participating children the following;

Sawgrass Springs Middle will begin the year with a "Title I Bulletin" that will be distributed via book bag to all students. This bulletin will contain "Right to Know Letters," information about the "Home-School Compact" location of the School Improvement Plan and Parental Involvement Policy, and information related to Parent Resource Centers. Additionally, each month, information is posted on the school's website in the "Title I Link" and also included in the "Title I Corner" of the school's monthly newsletter. These documents contain up-to-date information regarding parent activities, policies, and procedures related to the Title I Program.

The Title I Annual Public Meeting provides descriptions and explanations of the school's curriculum and academic expectations for proficiency in all subject areas and grade levels. This information is shared at monthly SAC meetings via Department Head presentations and the Principal's report. Our monthly SAC meetings provide the forum for parents to provide input and formulate suggestions related to decisions affecting the academic program. Parents are actively recruited for SAC, beginning with the Title I Annual Public Meeting and throughout the year at Title I Family Activities.

Parents have the opportunity to provide input through the year-end evaluation survey. Comments and suggestions will be taken into consideration and included in the annual "Review of the Parent Involvement Plan."

Parents will have the opportunity to provide input on the Home-School Compact. Comments and suggestions will be taken into consideration and included in the coming year's compact.

# Accessibility

Sawgrass Springs Middle School will provide full opportunities for participation in parental involvement activities for all parents (including parents with limited English proficiency, disabilities, and migratory children).

To ensure accessibility, particularly for our Hispanic/ELL population, flyers for parent involvement activities are sent home in Spanish to the extent possible. Parent informational brochures are also provided at the sign-in table in English and Spanish. Interpreters are on hand for each parent activity, and many sessions are held in both languages, so parents have a full understanding of the activities.

In order to increase the involvement of students with disabilities, additional invitations will be sent home this year to encourage additional participation and the ESE Specialist will take an active role in calling and personally recruiting parents.
