Engagement of Parents and Families

Parents are involved in the Title I program through monthly parent activities that begin early in the year with our Annual Title I Public Meeting during Open House. This meeting informs parents of the many components of the Title I program, introduces them to the schools' curriculum and various assessments in each subject area, and recruits parents in becoming part of the school's decision-making process. Through our SAC, PTSA, and Title I Family Nights, parents have the opportunity to attend staggered activities that involve them on various levels. SAC meetings throughout the year offer parents a vehicle for input into how parental involvement funds are used, what items should be included in the Title I Home-School Compact, the Parental Involvement Plan, and our School Improvement Plan. Parents also provide feedback on our yearlong activities through the Title I Parent Survey.

Parkway Middle School of the Arts quarterly Parent Newsletter, as well as its website contains a "Title I Corner" to keep parents up to date on Title I issues and various ways to communicate with the school. Along with flyers, we also have a Cavalier Week-at-a-Glace updates sent by email and phone communication weekly. A special Title I bulletin is sent home with all students in September to inform parents of School and District parent involvement policies, and how to access our School Improvement Plan. The bulletin also contains copies of "Parent Right to Know Letter" in English, Spanish and Haitian Creole.  in strategies that they may implement at home to help their child improve academically.
