Flexible Parent Meetings

Oakridge Elementary will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds provided under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

During many such sessions, snacks or a light meal are provided using Title I funds. Children are encouraged to attend and participate as their parents learn new strategies to use with them. Parent-teacher conferences are conducted at varied times with a focus on parents needs. Home visits by the School Social Worker are conducted on an as needed basis. Parent volunteer and partner orientation/appreciation breakfasts are held annually. It should be noted that these breakfasts are not paid for with Title I funds.

Parents are invited to share input and suggestions during SAC meetings, Title I public meetings, SAF meetings, parent training sessions, and parent-teacher conferences. Additionally, newsletters are digitally published as well as specific flyers are created and sent home when needed. Finally, Parent Link phone calls and emails are made weekly to provide parents with important announcements.
